

FIELD TELEPHONES

• Simple - Secure - Effective

• Minimum System: 2 phones and a pair of wires.

• Range: 11 - 17 miles on W-110-B Field Wire

• Talk Power: 2 flashlight batteries

• Signaling: Hand Generator





Light-weight "assault wire" may be installed quickly by one man.





Calls are routed by manually inserting patch cords in field switchboards.


USING THE EE-8 FIELD PHONE

(You'll be able to hear yourself talk if the phone is working properly.)





The Original Walkie Talkie

- SCR-194 Radio Set (BC-222), 28-52 Mhz (artillery)
- SCR-195 Radio Set (BC-322), 52-65 Mhz (infantry)
- · Designed at SCL Ft. Monmouth
- Early '30's ham-radio technology
- · 2 tubes, Super-regenerative Receiver
- 1-mile range

- Introduced 1935
- Used to good effect in pre-war maneuvers.
- · 20,000 units produced





SCR-536 (BC-611) Galvin Corp. (Motorola) - early 1942

- Frequency coverage: 2.0 6.0 mc
- Crystal controlled 1 Channel
- Type of signal: AM, voice
- Type of receiver: superheterodyne
- Power Output: 0.3 watts
- Tubes: 5
- Weight: 5 pounds
- Range: 1 mile +
- 206,000 units produced







MAN-PACK RADIOS

- · Portable communications for those on foot
- · Carried in pieces by 2-3 men
- Whip antenna for medium range: 10-15 miles
- · Wire antenna for long range: Hundreds of miles
- · Hand-crank generator for reliable power






SCR-298 FM Transmitter and Receiver

- Mobile FM Radio Set, 30-40 Mhz, 35 Watts
- Based on Link 25-XMTR used by CT State Police
- Evaluated in pre-war maneuvers.
- Established the viability of VHF FM

SCR 293 (TX-RX) - SCR-294 (RX only)

- · Link Corp.
- Frequency 20 to 27.9 MHZ Crystal Controlled
- Power output: High 25 Watt, Low ½ Watt
- Principal Components:
- · Delivered January 1942.
- First FM radios in combat (North Africa late 1942)
